**I**t's been seven years since the Ohio Bobcats rolled into North Texas and left town with a shutout victory and the Frisco Bowl trophy.

Ohio blanked San Diego State that night, 27-0, in chilly, soaked conditions. Fast-forward about a decade, and the Bobcats might have a new challenge: That great equalizer known as climate control.

Ohio (8-4) and UNLV (10-3) will take the 8th Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl indoors, with kickoff set for December 23 at the cozy, 12,000-seat Ford Center at The Star in Frisco, Texas.

With regular venue Toyota Stadium under renovation, the Frisco Bowl and the new Xbox Bowl (December 18) have moved to the Dallas Cowboys World Headquarters this bowl season.

UNLV, the Mountain West Conference runner-up to Boise State, reached double-digit victories in Mullen's first season as head coach. The former Mississippi State and Florida boss was named UNLV's coach a little more than a year ago. He's helped the Rebels extend a run of success after a 19-8 mark in two years under Barry Odom (now at Purdue).

For Ohio, could playing indoors be any advantage? The Bobcats are well-acclimated to the chill of outdoor football in December in the Mid-American Conference. The 2024 MAC champions gutted out a 31-26 victory against Buffalo on November 28 to finish the regular season. Low temperature in Athens, Ohio, that day: 21.

Calm conditions inside The Star, at least, shouldn't hinder Ohio's passing game. All-MAC quarterback

Parker Navarro finished the regular season with 2,232 yards and 14 touchdowns passing. He ran for eight more scores.

UNLV should have a full plate defending Navarro and All-MAC running back Sieh Bangura (1,243 yards, 14 TDs rushing), who became Ohio's fifth 3,000-yard career rusher.

Ohio's secondary, led by cornerback Tank Pearson (11 pass breakups, two interceptions), is tasked with trying to solve UNLV quarterback Anthony Colandrea, the MWC Offensive Player of the Year. Colandrea threw for 3,275 yards and 23 TDs for a .662 completion percentage.

The last UNLV passer named to a conference first team and as offensive MVP? Randall Cunningham in 1983 and '84 in the Big West. UNLV appears poised for more future success after signing the program's highest-rated (No. 56 by 247Sports) recruiting class to date.

"It's a great time to be a Rebel as we compete for Mountain West championships now and continue building a foundation for future championships," Mullen said.

"I think our guys are going to be excited because they want to get back out there and play again after (the Boise State loss)," Mullen said. "The opportunity to get out there and play in the next few weeks will be pretty exciting for us."



# SLADE LARSCHEID

OHIO UNIVERSITY DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

**S**lade Larscheid was appointed the Director of Athletics at Ohio University, President Lori Stewart Gonzalez announced on Sept. 8, 2025.

Since 2020, Larscheid has served as the Deputy Director of Athletics at South Dakota State University, overseeing the day-to-day operations of the department, which includes 19 sports and 500+ student-athletes. He earned a bachelor's degree in communications and a master's degree in sports administration from Northwestern University, where he was a three-year letterwinner for the Wildcat Football team, earning academic All-Big Ten and scholar-athlete honors in 2006.

At South Dakota State, Larscheid has oversight of all revenue generation and external relations, including fundraising, ticketing, marketing and communications. He has helped set records in fundraising and ticket sales, while serving as the liaison with the SDSU Foundation, Jackrabbit Sports Properties and SDSU Alumni Association.

Larscheid has also served as the sport administrator for the football and wrestling programs, with the Jackrabbits winning back-to-back FCS National Championships in football in 2022-23.

Prior to being named Deputy Director of Athletics, Larscheid served as a major gifts officer for the South Dakota State University Foundation. Prior to SDSU, he served as Director of Athletics at Augustana University from 2014 to 2018, during which student-athletes set academic records, the department established new revenue benchmarks and several teams won championships, including the NCAA Division II Men's Basketball National Championship in 2016. Larscheid previously held positions as a fundraiser at South Dakota State University, Northern Illinois University and the University of South Dakota.

A native of Spearfish, South Dakota, Larscheid is married to Stephanie, and they have four children: Mark, Samantha, Trace and Jo.

# JOHN HAUSER

## INTERIM HEAD COACH OHIO FOOTBALL

**J**ohn Hauser was named interim head coach on Dec. 1, 2025, after being promoted to associate head coach before the 2024 StaffDNA Cure Bowl. Hauser joined the Bobcats as the safeties coach prior to the 2022 spring camp. He was promoted to defensive passing game coordinator in spring 2023 and defensive coordinator in spring 2024.

The 2024 season capped off another historic season for the Bobcats, marking the program's first 11-win season, sixth consecutive bowl victory and their first Mid-American Conference Championship win since 1968. In the MAC Championship against Miami (Ohio), Hauser's defense held the RedHawks to just three points, marking the first time a team hasn't scored a touchdown in the MAC Championship as well as the largest margin of victory (38-3).

The 2023 defense played a crucial role in the team's 10-win season, finishing the season No. 1 in the Mid-American Conference and No. 4 in FBS football. Notably, the defense held Power 5 opponent to only seven points (Sept. 16), Western Michigan (Oct. 21) to their lowest number of rushing yards in the season (79) and set the program record for the most turnovers forced in a bowl game (5) at the 2023 Myrtle Beach Bowl.

Ohio's 2022 defense finished second in the MAC in points allowed per game (21.1), less than a quarter of a point behind the leader. After their seven-game winning streak against MAC opponents, safety Tariq Drake was one of three Bobcats to earn All-MAC Third Team honors.

Previously, he was Miami's cornerbacks coach for eight years and co-defensive coordinator for six years. His first year with Miami was a memorable one, as he helped coach Quinten Rollins, who was a four-year letter-winner on the Miami Basketball team and joined the football team in April for Spring practices. Eight months later, Rollins finished the year with seven interceptions and a MAC Defensive Player of the Year Award. He would later go on to be drafted in the second round of the NFL Draft by the Green Bay Packers. Hauser continued to produce All-MAC talent at Miami, highlighted by two-time All-MAC honoree Heath Harding was a two-time

All-MAC honoree and MAC Defensive Player of the Game Emmanuel Rugama.

Prior to Miami, Hauser spent two seasons at The Citadel as the safeties coach after briefly leaving coaching to be the director of player personnel at the University of Illinois for two months. While at The Citadel, Hauser was responsible for the development of Nick Willis, who as a true freshman, earned a spot of the Southern Conference All-Freshman Team.

From 2009-12, he was the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach at Wayne State University, where he also worked with special teams and coordinated recruiting efforts in Michigan and parts of Ohio. While at Wayne State, Hauser oversaw a unit that finished in the top-10 nationally in Division II in scoring defense, finished #1 nationally in Sacks (48), #5 in interceptions (23), #8 in takeaways (36) and produced four all-conference defensive backs and a pair of All-Americans and 11 First team all-conference defensive players. With Hauser playing an integral role, the Warriors turned the corner from being a program with no prior history of success into one that set school records for most wins in a season and advanced to the NCAA Division II title game in 2011. Defensive players Jeremy Jones, Daunte Akra and Raleigh Ross were all free agent acquisitions in the NFL.

Hauser spent 2003-08 with Northern Illinois, starting off as a graduate assistant before becoming their defensive backs coach in 2006. While at Northern Illinois, he helped lead the team to three straight Mid-American Conference Western Division championships and three bowl appearances and coached All-MAC safety Dustin Utschig.

Hauser started his career in 2002 at his alma mater, Wittenberg University, where he was an assistant coach. While he was a student-athlete at Wittenberg, Hauser was named all-conference three times and earned a spot on the Division III All-American team in 2002. In his four years at Wittenberg, the team combined to finish 40-6 overall.

He and his wife, Seanna, have a daughter, McKenna, a son, John Jr. ("JJ") and twins, Jackson and Maria.



# ERICK HARPER

## UNLV DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

**E**rick Harper was selected as UNLV's 14th permanent Director of Athletics on Jan. 1, 2022, after having served as interim AD during the preceding four months.

Harper oversees all aspects of the athletics department and the Thomas & Mack Center, including general operations, fiscal affairs, facilities, strategic planning, and external relations.

Since assuming his position, Harper has affected significant change. Under his leadership, a new strategic plan was announced that is aimed at helping deliver a premier student-athlete experience in college athletics and providing Rebels the opportunity to succeed as students, athletes, and into the future as well-rounded community leaders. In alignment with the broader UNLV Top Tier 2.0 Strategic Plan, the athletics department worked in tandem with the University to develop a clear strategy for achieving athletic and academic excellence.

The Rebels have excelled in both of those areas with Harper at the helm. In just his first three seasons, 13 UNLV teams claimed conference championships, with 10 league Coach of the Year honorees and multiple teams earning trips to the NCAA Tournament. In addition, UNLV took back the annual Silver State Series trophy during the 2022-23 season by recording the third-highest score in the history of the competition, which is a formal head-to-head athletic and academic challenge between longtime rivals UNLV and UNR. The Rebels again claimed victory against the Wolf Pack the last two seasons.

Fundraising has been a major focus under Harper as well. The department has received hundreds of major gifts from individuals since he took over, benefitting student-athlete scholarships, health and mental wellness, nutrition, academic support and capital projects. In 2023, the department launched its first-ever athletics-specific capital campaign with a goal of \$150 million, called "Rebel Up."

In November 2025, UNLV Athletics announced the largest endowment in its history -- a \$10 million commitment from William S. Boyd and Judy Boyd to establish an endowment for student-athlete nutrition.

In December 2025, in a groundbreaking move ahead of the anticipated NCAA approval of corporate jersey patches, UNLV and Learfield's UNLV Sports Properties, the exclusive multimedia rights-holder for UNLV Athletics, announced a five-season partnership naming Acesso Biologics as the Official Jersey Patch Partner for UNLV Football, Runnin' Rebels Men's Basketball, Lady Rebels Women's Basketball, and Hustlin' Rebels Baseball. With this new agreement, Acesso Biologics becomes the first official multi-sport corporate jersey patch and on-field logo partner in NCAA athletics.

Harper serves on the NCAA Division I Football Oversight Committee and was named Administrator of the Year for 2023-24 by The Leadership Playbook. He served on the 2024 Super Bowl Host Committee board and is an active board member on the Las Vegas Bowl Committee and MW Recognition Committee. He also served as the Mountain West Directors of Athletics' Chair for 2023-24.

Prior to becoming Director of Athletics, Harper served nine years as UNLV's senior associate athletics director for development.

Prior to UNLV, Harper was associate athletics director for football operations at the University of Arizona from 2003-11. He began his athletics administrative career at Kansas State University (1990-2003), where he served in development, marketing, and compliance roles and as a sport administrator for multiple sports.

Harper earned his bachelor's degree in 1992 from Kansas State, where he was a four-year starter and standout defensive back for the Wildcats football team. He later earned a master's in organizational management and leadership from Ashford University in 2013.



# DAN MULLEN

## HEAD COACH UNLV FOOTBALL

**U**NLV football made a historic hire on Dec. 12, 2024, as longtime SEC head coach Dan Mullen was appointed the new head coach of the Rebel football program. A 103-game winner at the University of Florida and Mississippi State University, Mullen returned to the sidelines in Las Vegas after spending the last three seasons as an ESPN college football analyst.

The 14th head coach in UNLV history, Mullen brought to Las Vegas nearly three decades of coaching experience, including 13 as a head coach. He spent nine years at the helm of MSU and a combined eight years at Florida, first as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach and returning to Gainesville to lead the program from 2018-21.

After coaching UNLV to a 10-3 mark and first-place regular-season finish in the Mountain West in 2025, Mullen now has an 113-64 overall record and a 7-3 bowl game mark while leading a program. His winning percentage in bowl games (.700) ties him for the third-best such mark in college football history and he has seen 76 players under his guidance drafted in the NFL.

Earlier this season he was one of 28 names making up the 2025 Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year watch list. In his debut season at the school, Mullen guided the Rebels to their first 6-0 start since 1974 after defeating every non-conference opponent in the same season for the first time ever. UNLV, which is making a bowl trip for the third consecutive season for the first time ever, has scored at least 20 points in every game this season and has the best record under a first-year coach in its history. It marked the fifth time Mullen has been on a Bryant Award watch list.

Mullen compiled an overall 34-15 mark in Gainesville over four years and led UF to national prominence in just his first season. He and the Gators took the next step in his second and third

seasons with an SEC Championship Game appearance to highlight the 2020 campaign.

In 2014, Mullen was honored as the National College Football Coach of the Year by the Maxwell Football Club. He also garnered honors as the SEC Coach of the Year in the same season. His tenure in Starkville saw the program ascend to a No. 1 ranking during the regular-season and play in a school-record eight consecutive bowl games.

As the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at UF prior to joining MSU in 2009, Mullen helped produce a Heisman Trophy, Davey O'Brien and Maxwell Award-winning quarterback (Tim Tebow), along with a Rimington Trophy finalist (Mike Degory) and a Biletnikoff Award semifinalist (Chad Jackson).

Before heading to Gainesville for the first time, Mullen served as the quarterback coach for Utah with head coach Urban Meyer, helping develop Alex Smith - the first overall selection in the 2005 NFL Draft.

Prior to his time in Salt Lake City, Mullen served as quarterbacks coach at Bowling Green for two seasons, helping the Falcons record 6,627 yards of total offense with 81 touchdowns during that span. Mullen spent two years before his time at Bowling Green as a graduate assistant at Notre Dame, and before that assisted with Syracuse's 1998 Big East championship and Orange Bowl run.

Mullen was born in 1972 in Manchester, New Hampshire. He earned a bachelor's degree in exercise and sport science from Ursinus College in 1994 and a master's in education from Wagner College in 1996. A two-year starter at tight end for Ursinus College in Collegeville, Pennsylvania, Mullen earned First Team All-Centennial Conference honors as a senior.

He is married to the former Megan West and the couple has two children, son Canon and daughter Breelyn.


